

## United Health Foundation and Hispanic Federation: *Improving Chronic Condition Management*

Hispanic Federation is a national leader in promoting health awareness, education and increasing access to affordable and quality health care in the Latino community. Founded in 1990, Hispanic Federation addresses education, health, immigration, civic engagement, economic empowerment and climate justice issues within communities of color.

In 2023, the United Health Foundation, the philanthropic arm of UnitedHealth Group, and Hispanic Federation announced a three-year, \$3 million grant partnership to combat diabetes in Texas and Georgia. The program provides culturally relevant resources to encourage adoption and maintenance of physical activity and other healthy habits. Additionally, this partnership connects individuals to primary and mental health care and social drivers of health, including access to healthy food.
